PRE-K/K CAMP PROGRAM

(Ages 4-5)

DATES: June 30, 2025 - August 8, 2025

TIME: 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM Monday - Friday

COST: ~\$5500-\$5600

SCHEDULE:

- Finger Play: Finger painting, exploring different mediums
 - **Circle Time:** Daily schedule, discuss theme, social interaction, sitting and attending
- Move and Groove: Obstacle courses, passing activities, ball skills, balance, coordination, motor planning, cooperative play
- Snack: Self-help skills and social interaction
- Arts and Crafts: Drawing, cutting, coloring, stringing, stickers
- Lunch
- Sports: Introduction and enhancement of playing games/following rules, teamwork, foundational ball skills
- Journal: Representational drawing, recalling daily activities
- Handwriting: Pre-writing strokes, kinesthetic writing using different mediums, mazes, dot-to-dots, learning letters
- Free Play: Social interaction, motor planning
- Bike/Scooter riding
- Water Play
- Swimming

- Sensory Integration
- Zones of Regulation

GENERAL GOALS OF PROGRAMS

WE WORK TO ADDRESS EACH CHILD'S ABILITY TO:

- Transition in and out of activities
- Explore various textures with hands
- Sit and attend to circle time activities
- Sequence and perform multi-step activities
- Demonstrate age-appropriate sports skills (kicking, throwing, catching)
- Engage in cooperative and turn-taking activities with peers
- Demonstrate age-appropriate coloring and cutting skills
- Sequence and complete art projects
- Identify "Zone" and activities to help stay in the "Green Zone"
- Generate ideas for activities and play safely with peers during unstructured play

COVID SAFETY MEASURES

CDC guidelines and regulations will be followed. Examples include:

- · Therapists will be vaccinated
- All children and adults will be required to wear masks
- Camp will take place in an area that is separate from other people
- Outdoor space will be used as much as possible for crafts, lunch, movement
- Equipment and supplies will be cleaned every day
- Parents will be asked to take their child's temperature and monitor for symptons
- Children who test positive or who have someone living in their house who tests positive, will follow CDC guidelines regarding quarantine and testing
- Camp enrollment will be for the length of the program (not week by week) in order to minimize interaction/exposure

TIME: 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM Monday - Friday

COST: \$5000-\$5600

SCHEDULE:

- Exploration with hands: Tactile
- Circle time
- Move and Groove: Obstacle courses, passing activities, ball skills, balance, coordination, motor planning, cooperative play)
- Arts and Crafts: Drawing, coloring, cutting, building/assembling projects
- Lunch
- Sports: ball skills, soccer, kickball, and baseball along with scrimmages
- Journal: drawing and handwriting activities
- Outdoor Play: social interaction and motor planning
- Bike riding
- Water Play
- Swimming
